AIMS	<ul> <li>enrich the oral language by impregnation, through the acquisition of lexicon, a better control of syntax, verb tenses and the use of connectors</li> <li>suscite someone to speak out through the desire to tell and the development of self-esteem</li> <li>invigorate the imagination, develop and train mental representation</li> <li>allow the child to experience a long speech</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>develop active, collective and individual listening skills</li> <li>create moments of conviviality between CP and CE2 pupils around the sharing of stories</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>discover and appropriate tales, elements of the intangible cultural heritage of humanity</li> <li>arouse curiosity for other cultures</li> <li>enhance the families' culture of origin</li> <li>foster cultural sharing between parents and children</li> </ul>

- weekly intervention of a storyteller for an oralised approach to storytelling		
- ritualised storytelling moments, in an arranged and reassuring setting, first with the storyteller and then taken up by the teacher		
- moments of exchanges with families, invitation to participate in the moments of storytelling with children		
- documentary research on the countries, the cultures from which the stories heard come from		
- sound captation of children storytellers		
- development of a storybook where each child can freely represent characters, objects, places of tales heard (drawing, collages)
